

## Memorandum of Understanding

This memorandum of understanding (hereinafter – the **Memorandum**) is executed by “**Alte University**” LLC, represented by its **President – Ramaz Kukuladze**, on one party; by **Higher Educational Institution “King Danylo University”**, represented by its **Rector – Myroslav Lutskyi** on other party; (hereinafter “**Parties**”), collectively agreeing to the following terms:

### 1. General Terms

- 1.1. The **Memorandum** serves as the foundation for mutual cooperation between the **Parties** involved.
- 1.2. The **Memorandum** defines the main directions and terms of mutually beneficial cooperation between the **Parties**, their administrative and academic staff and students.

### 2. The objectives of cooperation

**The objective of cooperation between the Parties is as follows:**

- 2.1.2.1. To ensure the formation of students as highly qualified specialists and to enhance the experience of administrative and academic staff, through the development of an effective system of mutual cooperation; Promotion of intercultural awareness, competitiveness of students/staff and their career development.
- 2.2. Strengthening intercultural, multidisciplinary, innovation-oriented, and sustainable development focused teaching, learning and research activities.
- 2.3. Sharing experience to ensure the development of educational programs and administrative services, while providing access to innovations introduced by the **Parties** for students and administrative/academic staff.

### 3. Subject of the Memorandum

3.1. The scope of the **Parties** cooperation includes:

- 3.1.1. Exchange of knowledge between students and faculty/school members in computer science, business administration, law, psychology, tourism, medicine, dentistry and/or other programs in common between the **Parties**;
  - 3.1.2. Administrative staff study visits; academic and student exchange and/or study visits; Cooperation between students unions/clubs;
  - 3.1.3. Collaboration in applied research in fields such as: medicine, artificial intelligence, computer science, business administration, etc.;
  - 3.1.4. Organizing interdisciplinary projects in fields such as: data science, artificial intelligence, computer science, etc.;
  - 3.1.5. Creating, carrying out and developing joint and/or dual degree programs; Supporting with external collegial evaluation of existing programs;
  - 3.1.6. Co-hosting and/or participating in international conferences, seminars, trainings and summer schools;
  - 3.1.7. Collaborating with industry to support organizations in solving challenges they face, supporting innovation ecosystems;
- 3.2. The **Parties** within the framework of the **Memorandum**:
- 3.2.1. Will facilitate the sharing of experience in the fields of education and science;
  - 3.2.2. Will carry out the planning/formation of educational programs (educational components) that align with the needs of the society and the requirements of the labor market;
  - 3.2.3. Will promote the students to acquire practical knowledge and experience;
  - 3.2.4. Will facilitate the organization and implementation of joint projects, research and thematic events (conferences, public lectures, seminars, trainings, master classes, etc.);

- 3.2.5. Will promote the mutual availability of each other's material resources (studios, laboratories, library resources, etc.) for students and staff, and their use for the implementation of specific activities within the framework of educational components;
- 3.2.6. Will promote mutual sharing of experience in teaching and learning methodological issues;
- 3.2.7. Will consider any other forms and directions of cooperation that are not reflected in this memorandum.

**4. Intellectual Property Rights**

- 4.1. The **Parties** agree that the ownership and any other rights related to intellectual property arising from and/or related to the implementation of the activities specified in the **Memorandum** will be determined individually, in a separate written agreement between the **Parties**, with respect to each activity.

**5. Confidentiality**

- 5.1. The **Parties** agree and undertake to maintain the confidentiality of any information/documentation shared within the framework of the **Memorandum**, except in cases where such information and/or documentation is publicly available.

**6. The term of the Memorandum and conditions of its termination**

- 6.1. The **Memorandum** shall take effect on the date when it is signed by both **Parties** and shall remain in force for a duration of 5 (five) years. Either **Party** may initiate the termination of this **Memorandum** by providing written notice to the other **Party** at least 90 (Ninety) days prior to the intended termination date.
- 6.2. In the event that the **Memorandum** is terminated, the **Parties** shall uphold ongoing projects and events initiated during the **Memorandum's** valid period.

**7. Additional terms**

- 7.1 This **Memorandum** is executed in both English and Georgian languages in two counterparts of equal legal force.
- 7.2 Both **Parties** mutually agree that, within the framework of the **Memorandum**, upon obtaining written consent from the other **Party**, information regarding their cooperation and/or executed projects may be published on the respective websites and social media platforms of the **Parties** for PR and marketing purposes. Each **Party** agrees that, upon obtaining written consent from the other **Party**, they have the right to utilize the other **Party's** name, logo, and/or other intellectual property for the PR and marketing purposes outlined in this article, as well as for achieving other objectives set forth in the **Memorandum**.
- 7.3 To prevent any potential misunderstandings, the **Parties** affirm that terms and conditions outlined in the 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> paragraphs of this **Memorandum** represent the rights of the **Parties** and not obligations, and that non-compliance with the stipulated terms and conditions shall not result in any legal consequences for any **Party**. In any other case, each **Party** have the right to refer to courts in the respective states to resolve the disputes.
